
FREE FROM THE GUARDIAN

CREED Nicene Creed

PROCLAMATION OF CHRIST


- As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

LORD'S PRAYER


Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven;

forever and ever. Amen.




