HE IS RISEN!.... He is Risen, Indeed!

What else could we have for the month of the Celebration of the Salvation of Mankind? People always associate the Resurrection with Salvation. That's not right, though. The Resurrection, Easter Sunday, is the Celebration of the Salvation accomplished on Good Friday. It's Jesus coming back, after descending into Sheol (Hades, Hell) to thumb His Divine Nose at the Devil, to declare Victory, and free those who were imprisoned. Easter Sunday was the Sign of Jonah that the Lord promised to His saints on Earth that they would witness, his proclamation of having won the War against the Devil, Death, Sin, and captivity to the Devil.

We were held captive. We were unable to do anything good. Everything we did was tainted with selfishness, with some consideration of "what do I get out of this?" There were exceptions, and Jesus pointed these out, in contrast to those were seeking vain-glory. Jesus gives a clear example of people who do this when He watched the rich man and the poor widow woman: There was the rich man who made sure that the people saw that it was his servants who were dumping money into the treasury of the poor. Then there was the poor widow woman who put into the treasury for the poor her two mites (each a Roman coin, a quadrans, worth 1/4 of a sesterce, which was 1/10 of a denarius). This was 1/20th of what a working man might make in a day. It was all that she had. Jesus knew this of her (He's God, after all), and He loved her for her heart of mercy and kindness for someone who likely was also a widow in need of Daily Bread. The rich man, however, did it out a desire for adoration as a philanthropist. He would have sought to be featured on Time Magazine had it been around in those days.

While we still are tainted in what we say and do, we are able now to filter these through the Holy Spirit within us, and so come through with gentler words than we might use had we not. Before I was a made a Christian, I was able to use a very sharp tongue to rip at someone who had verbally assaulted me, because I was able to find their weak spots, and capitalized on that. This was a great evil. For Christians, if we see someone's weak spot, we take care to try to understand that person through the lens of that weak spot. But, if someone is using that weak spot to exploit a situation, that cannot endure for long, either. You've all been in circumstances like that in life, I'm sure.

Here's what we know: as the Children of God, if someone is truly a "painted wall," like Caiaphas, the High Priest, it might be to that person's advantage in life to realize their hypocrisy, and so be given a chance to repent.

But, if someone is still tender in their weakness, like the woman who was caught in adultery, and dragged before Jesus, the word He spoke was of mercy, gentleness, reassurance, which led this woman to eternal life. We can all do this. No, we're not divine beings just like Jesus (not yet), but we are filled with the Spirit of God, having been buried into the death with Christ Jesus, and raised with Him to a new life, through Holy Baptism. And when we speak in Jesus' Name, we are able to confer His mercy and grace to those who are hurting from their sins.

As new Creations in Christ, we are now (the Biblical "BUT NOW" that a professor once called God's BIG BUT) able to be true ministers of grace in this world, and to manifest the gifts of grace. Let us rejoice in the new life into which we have been put, and BE the ones who touch the lives of others for the sake of Jesus.
