Living the Faith, Doing the Faith, Showing YOUR Faith

There are many passages in the Bible that get quoted by people who never really read the Bible, they just heard something somewhere. Maybe it was from a movie, or accidentally watching a TV Evangelist who was taking the Word of God out of context. Here are some examples, and stumbling blocks we need to avoid.

"Jesus is Love." Then they go and completely twist the meaning of "Love" to mean sexuality or selfishness (you know, "love thyself," which isn't in the Bible). The Love with regard to Christ Jesus means to do what is right under every circumstance, even for those whom you may not like that much. It also means to speak the truth as gently as possible, but not to let an error continue for long. For instance, it is not kind or merciful never to discuss your faith with someone who is not a Christian, just because you're afraid of upsetting that person. Yes, you have to have a trust, a friendship, to be heard, but do not leave a Hindu friend in the darkness of never having heard of Jesus. I hope that makes sense.

"Whatsoever you have done to these, My brethren, you have done it unto Me." That's wonderful, and so we all are called upon so to do. But, rarely do the TV people, or the movies, ever mention the second part of that: "Whatsoever you did NOT do for one of these, My brethren, you did NOT do it to Me." So, Jesus has us in the cross-hairs. If we have the resources to help someone in dire need, and choose not to do so, maybe because we don't like their clothing, their hair, or their skin color (yes, that's still a problem on ALL sides), but that person is a Child of God, then we are choosing to let Jesus go hungry, or thirsty, or naked in the cold. The difficulty is that there are people who pretend to be brothers or sisters in Christ, but are planning to bilk you for as much as they can. Yet, it is better to be deceived on the side of being merciful than it is to be correct, but for the wrong reasons. When making a decision, or even an a mistake, let it be on the side of the Gospel, of mercy, of kindness. Do we always do that? I can see in the past where I've skipped over certain beggars because I didn't like that they were wearing new shoes. Yet, how do I know they didn't just luck-out at Good Will? Mea Culpa. Mea Culpa. Mea Magna Culpa.

"Whosoever confesses Me before men I will confess before the Father." It is not enough of a confession of faith to say that you trust in Jesus only when in the company of other Christians. That's the easy way out. There's the other side. "Whosoever denies Me before men I will deny before the Father." That's the second half. If we are ashamed to be known as a peculiar people, a chosen people, in the company of non-believers, then we have denied the faith in our hearts. There's no need to be obnoxious about it, but if someone asks, do you give a statement of all that Jesus has done for you in your life? Or, just shrug it off, say something like, "It's a family tradition." There are such people. I've noticed that in the world the name "Lutheran" is becoming more and more ridiculed because all that people hear is about those "other" Lutherans, the WOKE ones with the practicing gay and transsexual pastors. The ones who keep doing offensive things like thanking God for an abortion. That means that WE, the Confessional, Traditional, Biblical Lutherans are not making a mark in the world. True, the News doesn't usually cover good things that happen, but word of mouth does get around, and if we, as a Church, do something magnificently merciful in the Name of Jesus, people will talk. That is also confessing Christ before men – by being a people whom others say are "different," in a good way.
