#### The Bible Says Busyness Causes Doubt and Disconnection from God

In Mark 4:18-19 Jesus explains, "And others are the ones sown among thorns. #### Changes are Coming - YAY!!!

We are very appreciative of how cooperative you been these past six months since we returned to in-person worship. During that time, we were very cautious. We checked temperatures and asked questions relating to your health and travel. We assigned seats and gave you worship materials in plastic bags. At some point we need to return to some form of pre-Covid normalcy, however, we are not going to do it all at once.

**Beginning Sunday, May 2**, the following changes will be made for worship:

- Temperature checks will not be taken upon entry. We trust you will not come if not feeling well!!!
- Upon entering the Sanctuary, you will receive your worship folder and communion elements (when applicable) from an Usher or Elder.
- If you have a Prayer Request that you would like included in the morning prayers, please write it out before coming to church and hand it to an Elder (Jim or Justin).
- We will not be assigning seats, however, we will continue to maintain social distancing. To do so, we ask that you sit at the end of the pews where the Bibles have been placed in the racks. Having the Bibles available to you gives you the opportunity to follow the readings during the service.

#### Beginning Sunday, May 9 (Mother's Day):

- Coffee-And... will resume outdoors, YAY!!!! weather permitting Tables and chairs will be not provided, therefore, you will need to bring your own chair.
- To celebrate Mother's Day, special cupcakes, and coffee, will be provided.
- We will continue holding Coffee-And... outdoors on a weekly basis, of course, weather permitting. Feel free to bring treats, however, items need to be store bought and individually pre-packaged. Please refrain from bringing home-baked items or items requiring to be cut. Coffee will be provided for you. Following these guidelines gives us an opportunity to visit with each other, which I know you all would like to do.

One thing that **WILL NOT** change – Pre-registration for the service will still be required.
